INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1) Go out and buy additional copies of this edition of MAD XL because you're bound to screw up the following directions on your first and second attempts!
- 2) Carefully cut out the Alfred face pattern along the dotted lines. To make the stencil easier to cut and use, you may want to glue the face pattern to a piece of thick card stock, a thick magazine cover or a thin piece of cardboard. We could go on listing things, but this is only a 96-page magazine!
- 3) Using an Exacto knife, razor or box cutter (you know, the one that almost got you tossed out of school), cut out the black portions of Alfred's face. IMPORTANT: BECAUSE YOU ARE READING MAD, CHANCES ARE THAT YOU ARE EITHER QUITE YOUNG OR QUITE SLOW (OR BOTH!), IN WHICH CASE YOU SHOULD FIND AN ADULT OR A GUARDIAN OR AN ATTENDANT TO DO THIS FOR YOU!
- 4) Place the stencil you have just created on the front of a pumpkin, taping it in place. Large eggplants are unacceptable!
- 5) Using a Magic Marker or paint sponge, fill in or dab over the stencil until the cut-out areas are covered. You will now have an image of Alfred on your pumpkin. If the image resembles Regis Philbin, you have messed up big time!
- 6) You may now either carve Alfred's face out of the pumpkin or simply leave the stenciled face as-is. Both are equally ridiculous!
